"Blockchains and Cryptocurrencies" February AAUW-NWV General Meeting

What is all the hype about blockchains and cryptocurrencies? I've heard about bitcoins, but what is this new technology? What do the terms mean? What will it mean to me? How safe are the various tokens used to send value and pay for transactions

To help you make sense of it all, our February general meeting program will focus on "*Blockchains and Cryptocurrencies*" and will be presented by Dr. Gary Marchant.

Dr. Marchant's talk will address the excitement with this technology? Although the first major application of blockchain is cryptocurrencies such as Bitcoin, there are numerous other applications ranging from energy and healthcare to real estate and financial services and more.

Dr. Marchant is uniquely positioned to present and synthesize information from a number of perspectives. Join us for what promises to be a most informative presentation focused on a technology that will have profound and widespread applications and implications for our entire economy and society.

Dr. Marchant, Ph.D., J.D., M.P.P., serves as the Regents' Professor and Lincoln Professor of Emerging Technologies, Law & Ethics, and Faculty Director of the Center for Law, Science & Innovation, at the Sandra Day O'Connor College of Law, Arizona State University (ASU). He also serves as a Professor at the School of Life Sciences and Distinguished Sustainability Scientist at the Global Institute of Sustainability at ASU.



Needs include -- canned products: hearty soups, vegetables (corn, green beans), tomato products (tomato sauce and paste, tomatoes, spaghetti sauce), beans, dinner products (ravioli, lasagna, chili, stew), tuna fish or chicken or ham, peanut butter and jelly, fruit, and condiments. Dry goods: oatmeal individual packets and canisters, top ramen, packages of potato, rice and pasta mixes, snack bars, crackers, cookies, cold cereal, macaroni and cheese mix, tea bags, hot chocolate, and coffee. The spring calendar for the branch **College Connection Team** is packed with activities in support of students at Glendale Community College and Ottawa University.

Yard Sale: Remember the clothing we donated last November to Glendale Community College? In February students members of Women Rising and M.E.N. will conduct their "Free to You Yard Sale". We hope our donations will be used by college students who are seeking a more professional look as they apply for jobs and enter the work force.

Women Rising: It is their turn. The students and advisors of Women Rising are "knee deep" in the planning for the Women Rising Conference, February 22nd at Glendale Community College. Close to 300 students from the other nine campuses in the Maricopa County Community College District (MCCCD) are expected to attend. Also invited are their advisors, speakers and guests. AAUW-AZ is a co-sponsor for this district wide conference.
